Special Provision Capital Fund

In March 2017 the Department for Education announced that Local Authorities would receive capital funding to support them in creating new places and improve facilities at existing schools for children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). The funding is expected to be used to develop provision for pupils with an Education, Health and Care Plan or a Statement of Special Educational Needs in mainstream and/or special schools. The funding can only be used for capital expenditure. The funding can be used at a broad range of settings including local authority maintained establishments, independent and non-maintained settings, academies as well as further education settings. It is not intended for Higher Education settings such as universities and any provision supporting those aged 25 and over.

Wiltshire Council was awarded £1,359,723 with the funding to be received over 3 years (the first installment received during 2018/19).

Following the guidance from the DfE, Wiltshire Local Authority are publishing this plan for the special provision capital fund.

Initial consultations took place through:

- A letter to all schools on the 16.6.2017 followed by informal meetings, Schools forum members, Specials schools project group meetings and discussion in three locally based SEN conferences in November 2017.
- Wiltshire Council alongside Wiltshire Parent Carer Council delivered workshops with parent carers from on the 1st, 4th and 5th of November 2017.
- During 2018 consultation took place regarding Special schools for children with complex needs in the north of the county which has helped to shape proposals for future provision
- During January and February 2019 consultations have taken place within three special schools (Larkrise, Rowdeford and St Nicholas), regarding the proposal for special schools, as well as wider consultations in community areas (in partnership with Wiltshire Parent Carer Council)

Wiltshire Plan


Wiltshire is proposing to allocate up to £1,326,723 of the grant to support the development of extra places. The existing plan will lead to:

- The creation of up to 303 special school and resource base places across the county in schools which are "Good", "Outstanding" or awaiting first judgement.
- Improvements to safety and environment for one school.

The funding is expected to spread across a minimum of ten schools. The screen shots below show these plans diagrammatically.
